SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE PUPILS

1. Dress Code:

- a) Pupils are to attend school in well round uniform complete with black shoes and a pair of white socks
- b) Male pupils are to cut their hair low. No sporting or jerry curls or other allied hair-do for male pupils.
- c) Female pupils are to plait their hair in strict obedience to a uniform style recommended every Friday by the school. No weave-on, no attachments, no packing of hair into a bun, no long and unkept dreadlock and no beads.
- d) Female pupils are not allowed to wear dangling or bogus earrings.
- e) School uniform should be worn with White top on Mondays and Thursdays, Cream top on Tuesdays, Sportswear on Wednesdays with white trainers/canvass while the customised T-shirt with black or blue jean and black shoe should be worn on Fridays.

2. Punctuality:

Pupils are to be in school latest by 7:30 am so as to participate in the morning drill exercise. Assembly starts at 7:40am. Absenteeism without a cogent reason and prior notice to the school management will not be tolerated.

3. Code of Conduct:

- a.) Vernacular speaking among pupils is highly prohibited.
- b.) There should be no rowdiness in the school. Serenity of environment is to be upheld by every pupil.
- c.) Every pupil is to strive to maintain a clean surrounding by picking up any piece of paper or other related refuse when sighted.

4. Tests and Examinations:

- a.) It is compulsory for every pupil to write all continuous assessment tests as well as end of term examinations. All continuous assessment tests and end of term examinations have their measurement before the end of year scores are finally determined.
- b.) Any pupil caught cheating during tests or examinations will be suspended or expelled as the case may be.

5. Extra Lessons:

To complement the effort of normal classroom work and avoid unnecessary failures, extra lessons may be organised as may be recommended by the school.

6. Reading Culture:

To help pupil gain an above average mastery of the English Language, it is compulsory for all pupils to visit at least the library twice in a week and attend Diction classes.

7. Conquering the Mathematics Phobia:

To help our pupils to excel in numerals, every pupil is expected to work on five sums daily.

8. Co-curricular Activities:

Since the school believes in education for self-reliance and purposeful all round education, pupils are expected to belong to at least one of the following clubs/groups:

- Literary & Debating Society
- Dramatic Society
- School Choir
- Red Cross Society
- Home Maker

- Spelling Bee

9. Others
